## Keynote Speaker - Craig Rennebohm, D. Min.



As a Chaplain, Craig has worked for the last twenty years on the streets of Seattle with individuals who are homeless and mentally ill. He serves as a resource to families and their loved ones facing mental illness; provides assistance to local congregations seeking to develop mental illness ministries and offers trainings for faith leaders, laity and mental health providers; and as a grassroots community health organizer. He is the author of *Souls in the Hands of a Tender God*, published in 2008, and the *Gentle Bible*, a set of daily readings supportive of healing, companionship and community, available from the Mental Health Chaplaincy in Seattle, which he founded.

Craig serves as a member of the *National Alliance on Mental Illness Faithnet Advisory Board*, the *Disabilities Ministries Board* of the *United Church of Christ* and as a consultant for *Pathways to Promise*, a national interfaith mental illness ministry.

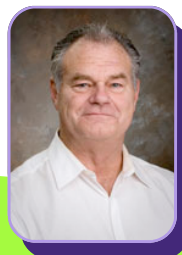
